Tom Blasingim informed the Commission that the numbers were impressive and that both clean-ups went well. A few issues needed to be addressed at Cabin Creek. Commissioner Wheeler said he got a call from a Mayor who informed him that he did not reach the dump until 4pm, and he was turned away and said there were almost 100 cars behind him. Tom Blasingim said by 4pm. every truck and hopper they had were full. The Sheriff's Office went through the line and told people where the cutoff was, and we just could not take any more. This program is successful and helps to keep the county clean.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

Shawn Legg stated that he spent 12 years as a firefighter. Every first responder understands that they may one day have to lay down their life for their job. However, on this occasion, two KCEAA employees had every tool at their disposal to ensure their safety, yet they chose to run over a man and drag him down the road for two miles. At that point, the man was no longer a threat. The Kanawha County Sheriff’s Office has not pressed charges against anyone involved. If this had been anyone else, they would have been arrested immediately. Many people have lost faith in Sheriff Joe Crawford and believe he needs to be removed from office. It should be up to the people to decide if he has done enough. Commissioner Salango expressed his appreciation for Mr. Legg’s comments and acknowledged that the family has spoken out several times, along with their lawyer. Commissioner Salango asked if Mr. Legg understood that the investigation was still ongoing.

Shawn responded, saying, "Yes, but this is a murder case, and those responsible could have already been arrested." Commissioner Salango said that, as the family mentioned on social media, over 400 pieces of evidence are under investigation. Commissioner Salango pointed out that voters supported the Sheriff in the 2024 election and stated that a person cannot be impeached before the next election. He suggested that opinions may change once the investigation is complete and emphasized that a grand jury will make a decision, which is confidential. Therefore, calling for impeachment during an active investigation is premature. Shawn replied, "This incident has changed many people's perspectives. He served as Chief of Police in St. Albans multiple times, and I have a high level of respect for him. This situation feels like a slap in the face." Rio Phillips, who lives in Kanawha City and is running for the U.S. Senate as a Democrat, stated, "If there are no charges, it will be clear that the community will be incredibly upset. Justice must be served, and I can feel the tension building in Elkview. I want peace and civility in our state. If no charges are filed, I will unite with citizens to call for the resignation of all elected officials involved. It is evident that the option to reverse any decisions was available." Commissioner Salango asked whether he understood that a criminal investigation was underway. Mr. Phillips stated yes, but it has been three weeks, and anyone else would have been arrested by now. It seems there is some protection for them. Commissioner Salango noted that the family has shared their concerns, and he is confident he has read their accounts. There are specific times of the year when the grand jury meets, and that process takes time, added Commissioner Salango. Mr. Phillips said that any ordinary citizen in West Virginia would already have been held accountable, and the people deserve a timeline for this. Commissioner Salango reiterated that the family has stated that they have seen over 400 pieces of evidence. When the Prosecuting Attorney's Office and the Sheriff review everything, it will be sent to the grand jury. Mr. Phillips stated that the people of Elkview want justice, and he is advocating for the citizens of Elkview, who need a timely resolution to this situation.




